To provide a humane rescue service for mistreated, abused, neglected, injured, unwanted, and surrendered equine animals



To provide traditional and non-traditional rehabilitation, medical care, food and shelter for equine animals in need of such care and to re-introduce the rescued equines to herd and human socialization

and provide appropriate adoption services for the

- Incorporate educational programs and interactions between the horses and humans; THR provides Therapeutic Riding programs for disabled children, adults and assists their families
- Maintain a volunteer program where participants will assist in providing daily care and maintenance at the facility; also offer participation of trained volunteers to assist in the Therapeutic Riding arena
